You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High.

-Luke 1:31-32

t occurred to me once that in the eyes of those around her, Mary's virginity was probably dubious. Never mind them, we say. The angel never spoke to them. We know the truth.

However, Mary probably had to deal with their doubts anyway. I thought of this because at the time I became pregnant, the Lord had highlighted Luke 1:31-32 for me in a special way, and I was resisting the idea that these words might apply to my child, too. Unlike Mary, I had sinned.

I was brought to understand that these verses point to the importance of every birth. God has a name for every child even before birth—and not only a name but a special assignment.

Each child born is intended by God as a gift to the world. Each child is handpicked and custom-designed to bless the receiving world. It is not the child's fault, but the world's, if the

gift is rejected, and it is the world's loss as well. If received, every child is necessary to the wellbeing of its parents and the planet. It seems to me that a good deal of what is wrong with the world comes from children (and adults) believing they are not really needed. This is a *lie*.

I have never liked the term *illegitimate child*—as if the child were at fault for being born. God was saying to me through this verse, "I legitimate this child; I have chosen her to be born and to be the one to bless you and, in a special way, the earth."

My friend, Anne, an African American single parent, says that she was raised in small-town Mississippi to believe it was her job to "prepare myself to advance the race."

What if every child knew without question that he or she was born to be great, to be the child of the Most High, and to "get ready to advance" the human race?
